The Great Horned Owl pictured is our version of "Angry Bird"!!! This owl was hit by a car and suffered a broken wing. His wing is set and will be several months at our center. We currently have 8 Great Horned Owls in care! Several are suffering from west nile virus symptoms. They are improving though which is good news. They just require months and months of supportive care to live through it. Their bodies will start to produce antibodies to fight off the virus and then will not be at such a high risk in the future to get it again. If you see an owl on the ground during the day it is typically not a good sign. Please call our center for instructions on how to safely gather up the owl (or any other wildlife) and bring it to our center. Please remember that their feet are the most dangerous part and even a sick or injured animal can and will defend themselves if they're able.
